Also this winter, please remember that CJTU will be participating at the annual NJ Outdoor & Sportsman Show this January 12 – 15 at Raritan Center in Edison. Also in January, is the Fly Fishing Show at the Garden State Exhibit Center in Somerset, January 27, 28 & 29. These are always great places to stock up on your gear. On February 18th, CJTU will host a fly tying demo at Ray's Sport Shop in North Plainfield.

And now for the news....At the State level, Marty McHugh, the present Director of the NJ Division of F&W, is resigning from his position to pursue other interests effective January 3. I want to thank Marty for his 3 years of service and dedication to the state Fish & Wildlife Division. It is not clear who his replacement will be as of this writing, however I will be sure

to fill you in as information becomes available.

At the National level, with the help of Trout Unlimited, the proposed measures in S-1932 were defeated. This measure would have allowed for the sale of public lands to mining companies and other development interests leading to the most certain destruction of trout and salmon watersheds. As indicated by a letter from Brian O'Donnell, Director of the Public Lands Initiative, this "was one of the one of the worst attacks on public lands in many years." It was the help of TU which contributed to defeating this measure!

Don't forget our fly-tying classes begin again this January. Please look for the details inside this newsletter.

CJTU Passes Yearly Financial Audit

On October 24,2005, the financial records of Central Jersey Trout Unlimited were audited by accountant Ken Devory. This included a review of financial documents (bank statements), receipts and payments for the year 2004. All records requested for the audit were available and complete. The Treasurer's Reports/Reconcilliations as submitted to the Board of Directors at each monthly Directors Meeting have been validated - which verifies that the CJTU Board has been properly informed of the Chapter's financial position on a monthly basis. All of the Treasurer's records audited were in order. It was also determined that receipts are being received by the Chapter for all reimbursements, and all indications are that all monies are being deposited into and payments made from the Chapter's checking account. Ken Devory goes on to say that based on this audit, during which standard procedures were utilized, results indicate that all financial records for CJTU are being properly maintained and are accurate.

The complete audit report has been filed with the Chapter Secretary.

Beginners Fly-Tying Class: This is our entry level class for the person just getting started in fly-tying or who has very little experience. We will cover the basic tools, techniques and materials necessary to tie a variety of basic flies, concentrating on patterns that work well on local rivers and streams.

Intermediate Fly-Tying Class: This class is for the intermediate tier who has acquired the basic skills in handling tools and materials either by previously taking a beginners course and/or tying flies regularly for a year.

Fly-Tiers Workshop: The workshop is designed for the student who has taken our intermediate level course and wants to improve their tying skills and keep current with techniques and materials.

Fly-tying sessions will be held in the Knights of Columbus Hall, South and Grove Streets, Dunellen, NJ 08812.

This course is open to members and non-members. We welcome anyone who has an interest in the sport of Fly-Fishing or Fly-Tying.

We have many talented instructors who are more than willing to pass on the legacy. We expect to have an instructor for every three or four students, enabling each person to have a great amount of individual attention.

As CJTU's representative and a participating board member of the Musconetcong Watershed Association, I have much to report to the chapter. For some time now, the MWA has been aggressively working with local and state elected officials, and other environmental organizations to have the Musconetcong River added to the Wild and Scenic Registry. This move would help protect the river, improve water quality, guard the fishery, protect scenic vistas, and enhance public access to the river for public recreation. In addition, the river would be eligible for millions of dollars in federal preservation support.

Earlier this year Senator Jon Corzine introduced a bill into the U.S. Senate which would designate the 'Muskie' as a Wild and Scenic River. In October, Congressman Scott Garrett (NJ-R-5th Dist) introduced a bill in the House to amend the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act to designate portions of the Musconetcong River as a component of the National Wild and Scenic Rivers System.

More good news followed in late October when we received news that this House bill would be heard by the House Committee on Resources, Subcommittee on National Parks, Recreation and Public Lands. In November, I traveled to Washington, D.C. with Susan Dickey, Musconetcong Advisory Committee Chairperson, and founding MWA member to attend this House hearing. At the hearing both Susan and Congressman Garrett testified.

I am pleased to report that on December 16th, of 2005, the Wild and Scenic bill passed through the Senate unanimously. According to Congressman Garrett's office we can expect a markup early next Congress and hopefully the House will vote shortly thereafter.

On behalf of Central Jersey Trout Unlimited I would like to thank Governor-elect Corzine and his staff for their help on the bill. This legislation, and eventual wild and scenic designation, will help protect and preserve one of our state's great rivers.
